Health and Physical Education are two of the most important subjects on DHS's curriculum. Participating students are encouraged to be fit physically as well as mentally, socially, and emotionally.

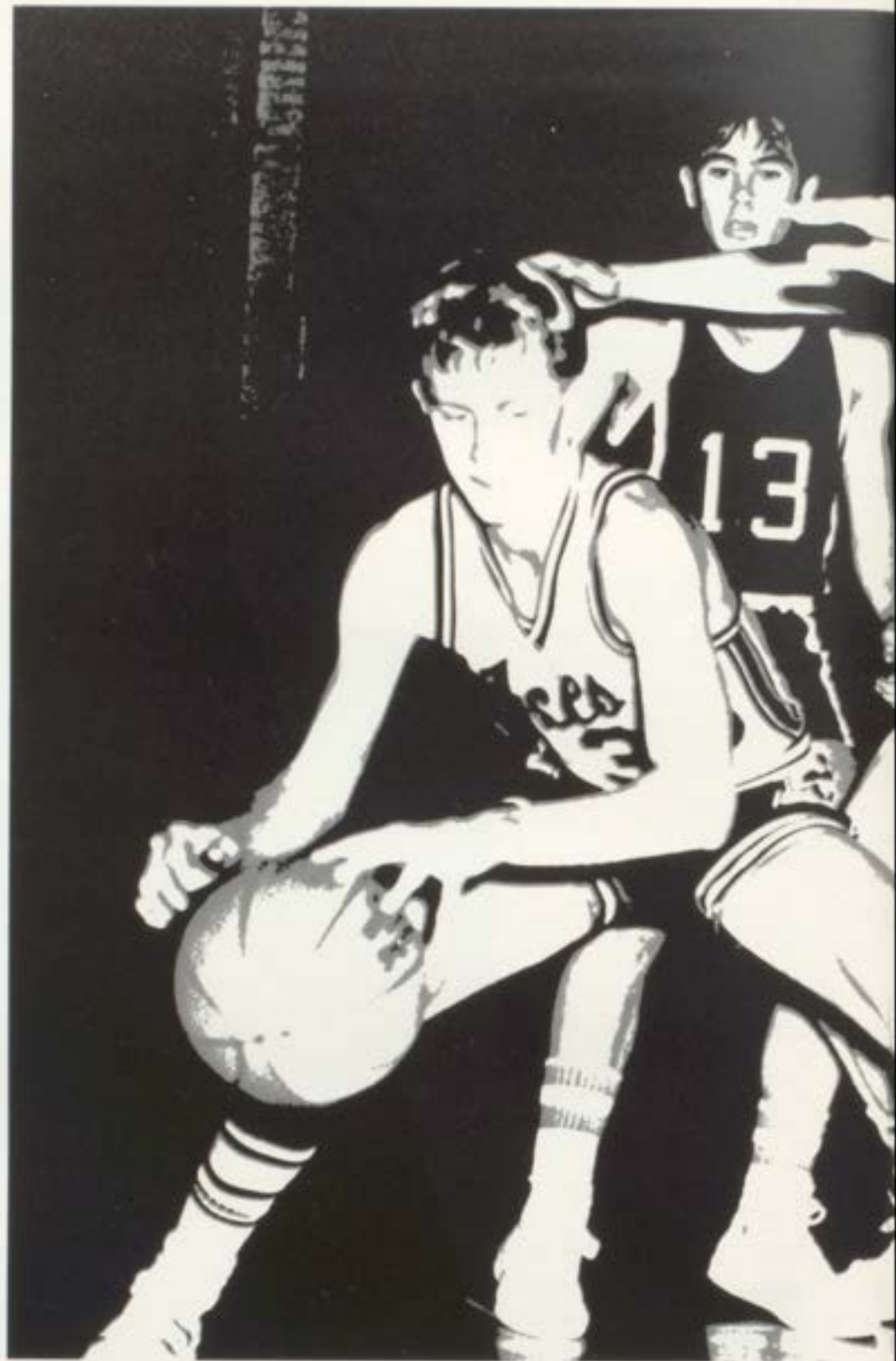


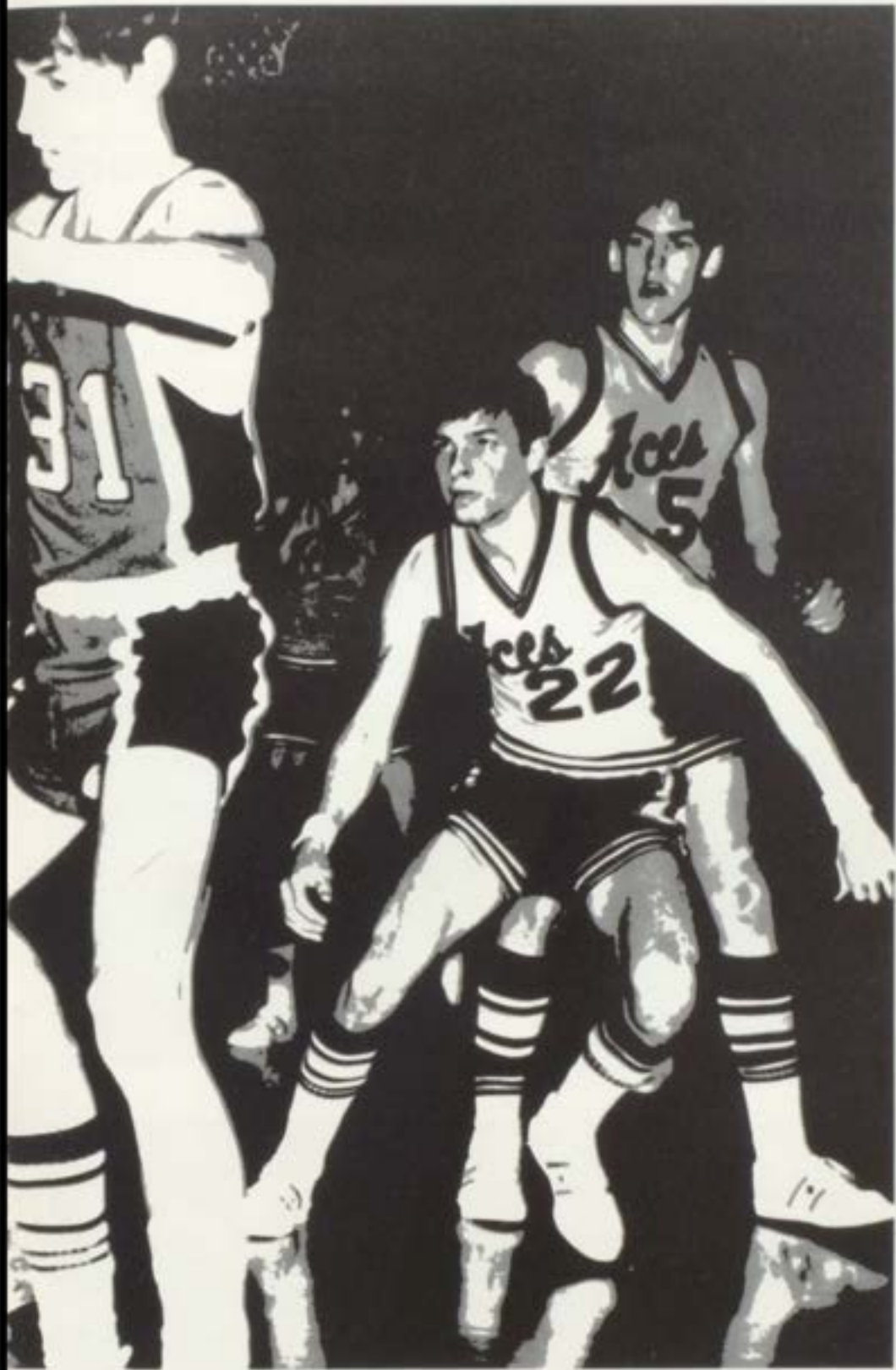
Preparation for Future Vocations

ROCKPORT, Ind. — South Spencer clinched at least a tie for the Pac Athletic Conference crown but had to feel an all-out aerial blitz by Dale's Ken Guth to hang up a 20-20 verdict here Friday night. The Rebels closed out their season 3-1 and scored a tie with Huntington which must still face the Aces' pass attack. Guth riddled a 23-yard strike to Rick Robinson in the first quarter to give the Aces a brief 7-0 lead at half but Jim Turner's 30-yard pass interception gave the Rebels an 18-7 lead in the third period. John Burroughs ripped a 48-yard pass to Mark Tabor to give the Rebels a 12-7 lead they never yielded. Guth also fired TD fire to Tom Labbe for 30 yards and in Robinson again as the game ended. The Aces fell to 4-4 with the Panthers on top.
