A four year tighi school couric was included th the curficulum tn 1907. The first four year high school class graduated in 1911. The flrst yearbook was published in 1949, and this 1972 Reflector will be the last CHS yearbook.

The old 92 year old building is beling replaced by the new Heritage Hills High School.
