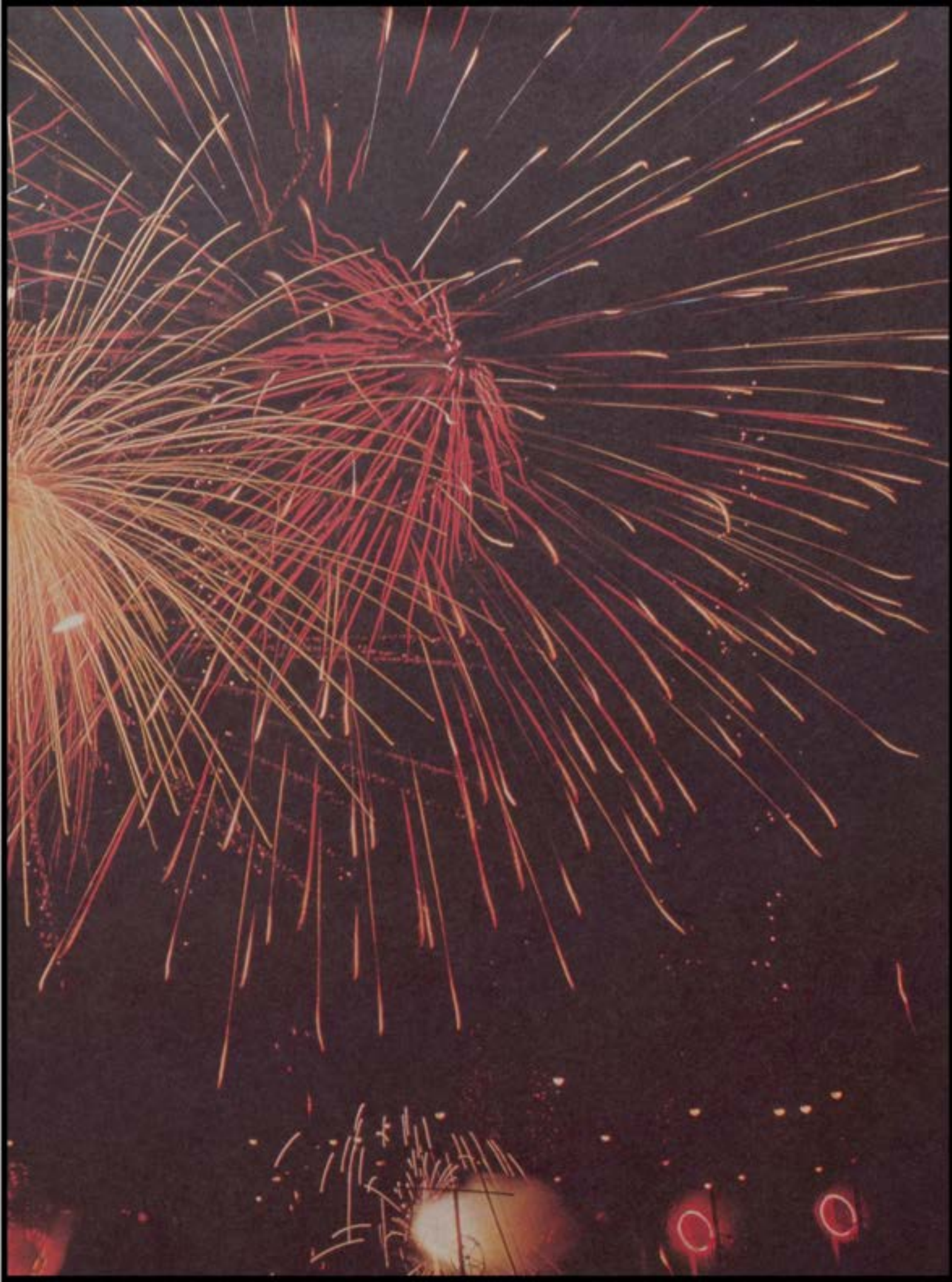


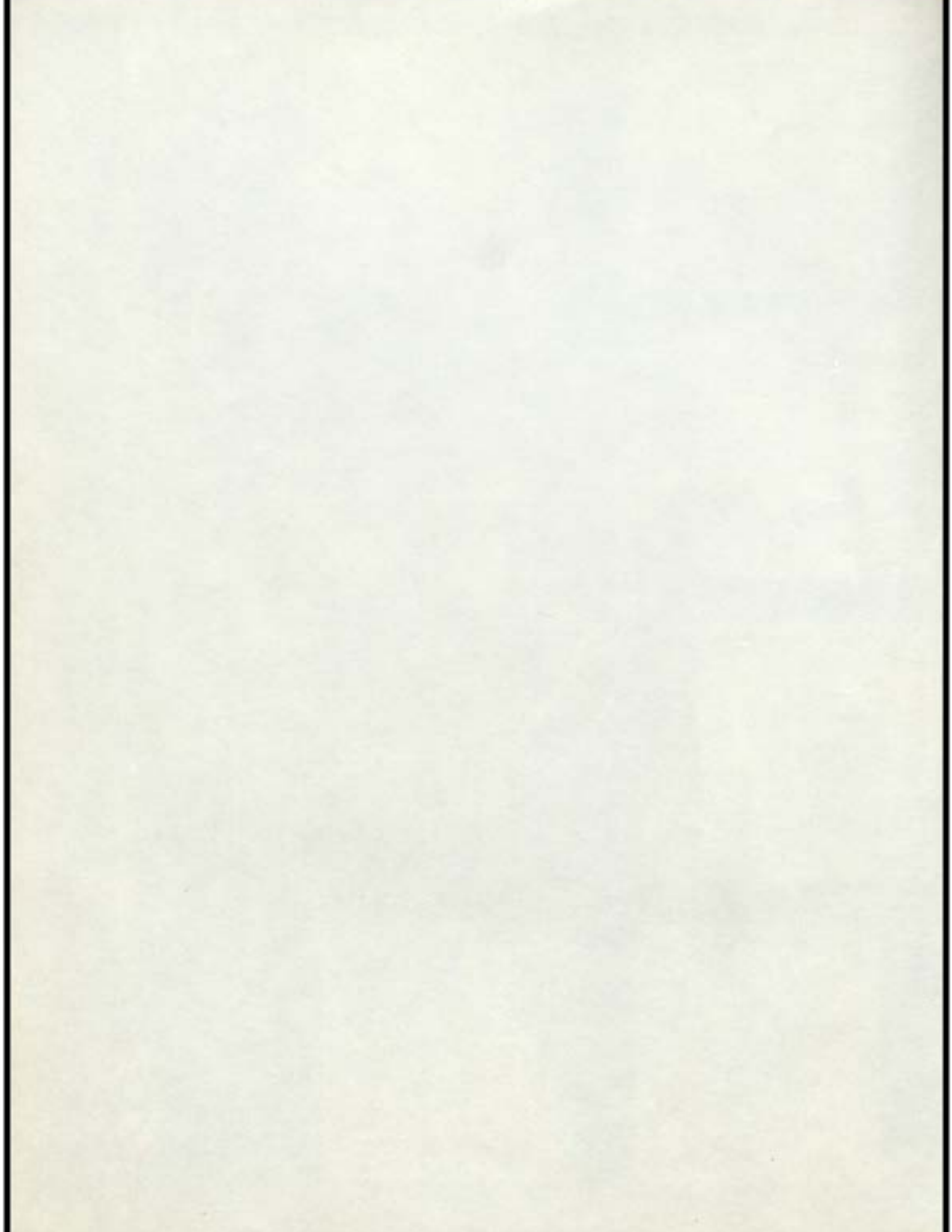

In 1880 work began on the first school built in Chrisney. Two more rooms were added in 1915. Another addition was completed in 1930. The science room, shop room, and rest rooms were added in 1951. A four year high school course was included in the curriculum in 1907. The first four year high school class graduated in 1911. The first yearbook was published in 1949, and this 1972 Reflector will be the last CHS yearbook.

The old 92 year old building is being replaced by the new Heritage Hills High School.

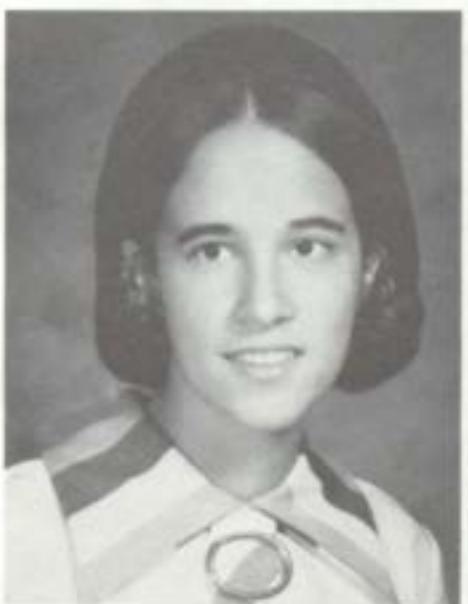

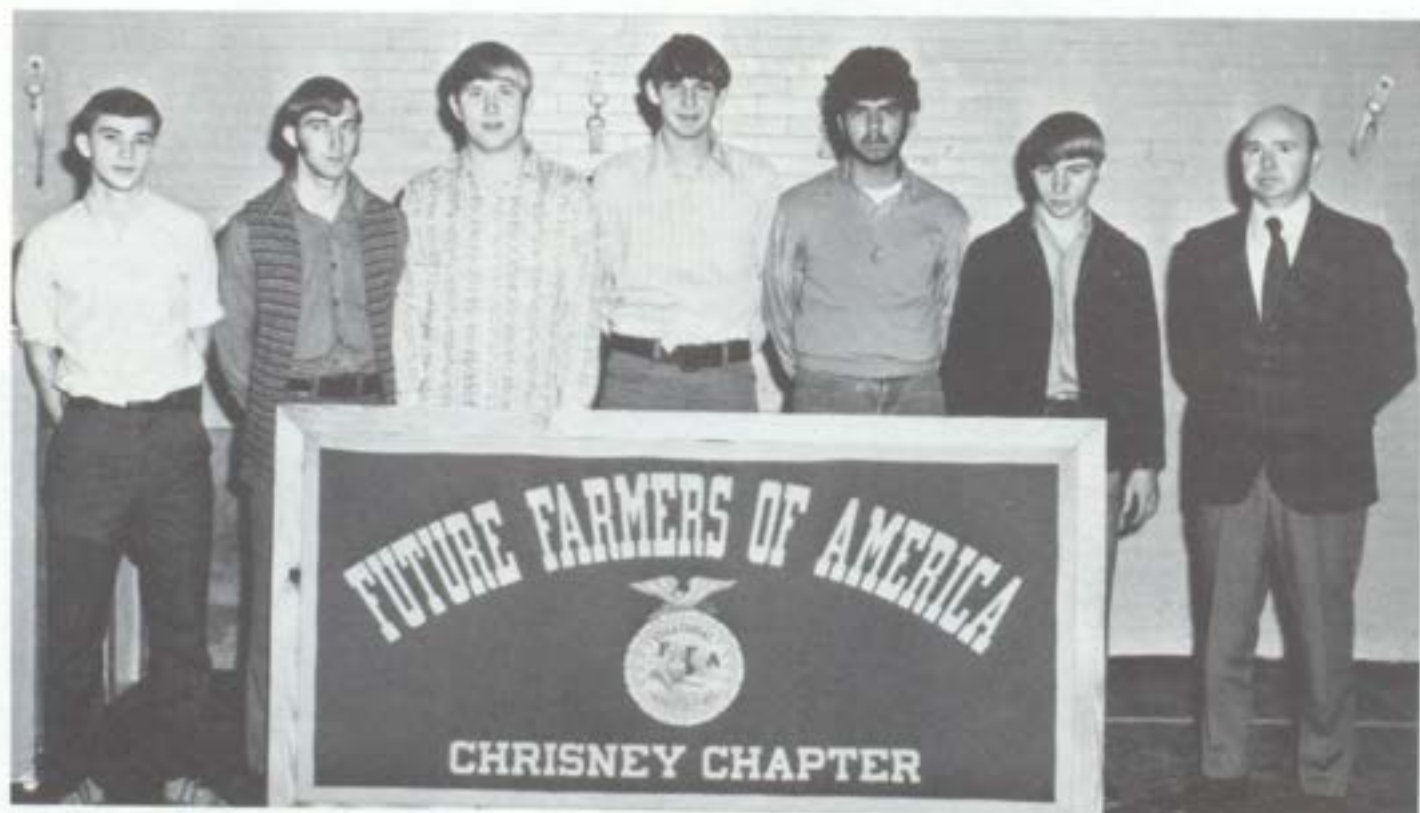
