The 1964 "Reflector" invites you to climb aboard our steamship to inspect our school year and take a look at what has taken place during this year's cruise.

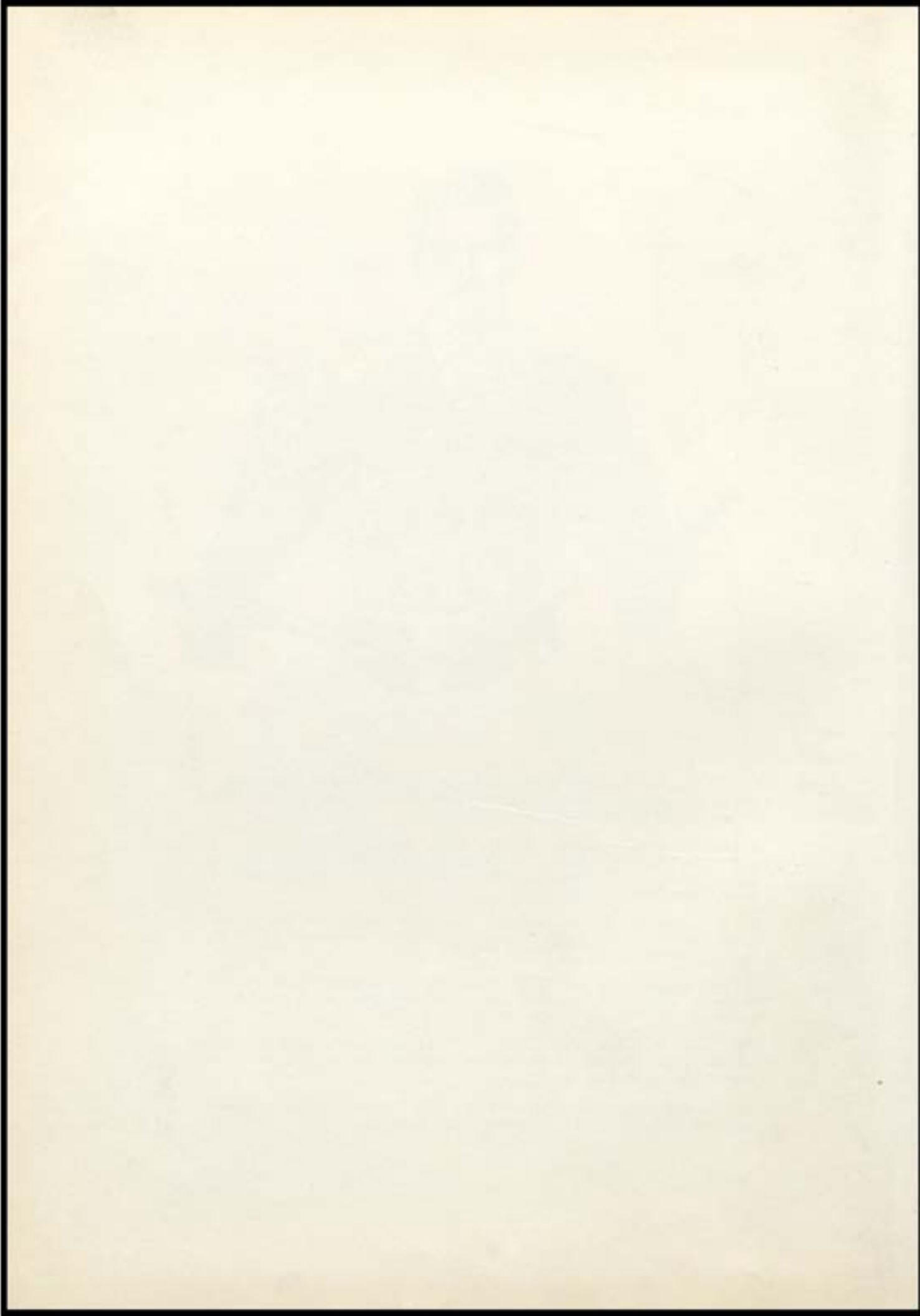
Since September, many things have happened that we never want to forget. Here in this edition of your Annual, we hope to have captured the outstanding events of this year's class work and activities.


This year, no doubt, seemed somewhat bewildering to the Freshmen, but we hope that they will remember it as an unforgettable part of their lives.

May we all look upon these months and remember all our happy days aboard the S. S. Chrisney High School.

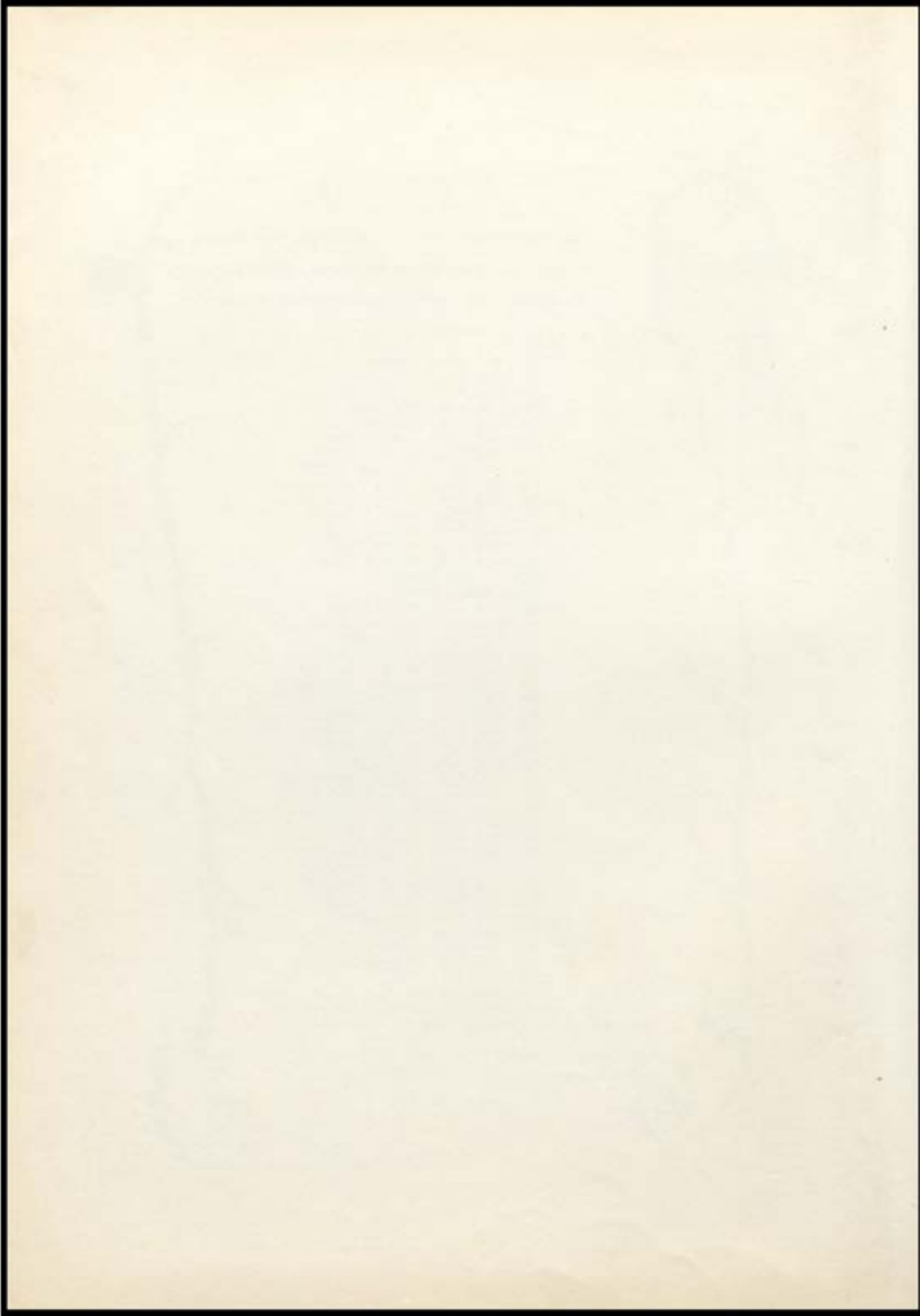

There also seemed to be several new faces among the class, Bill Shelby, Aubrey Bullington, and Lester Walters.

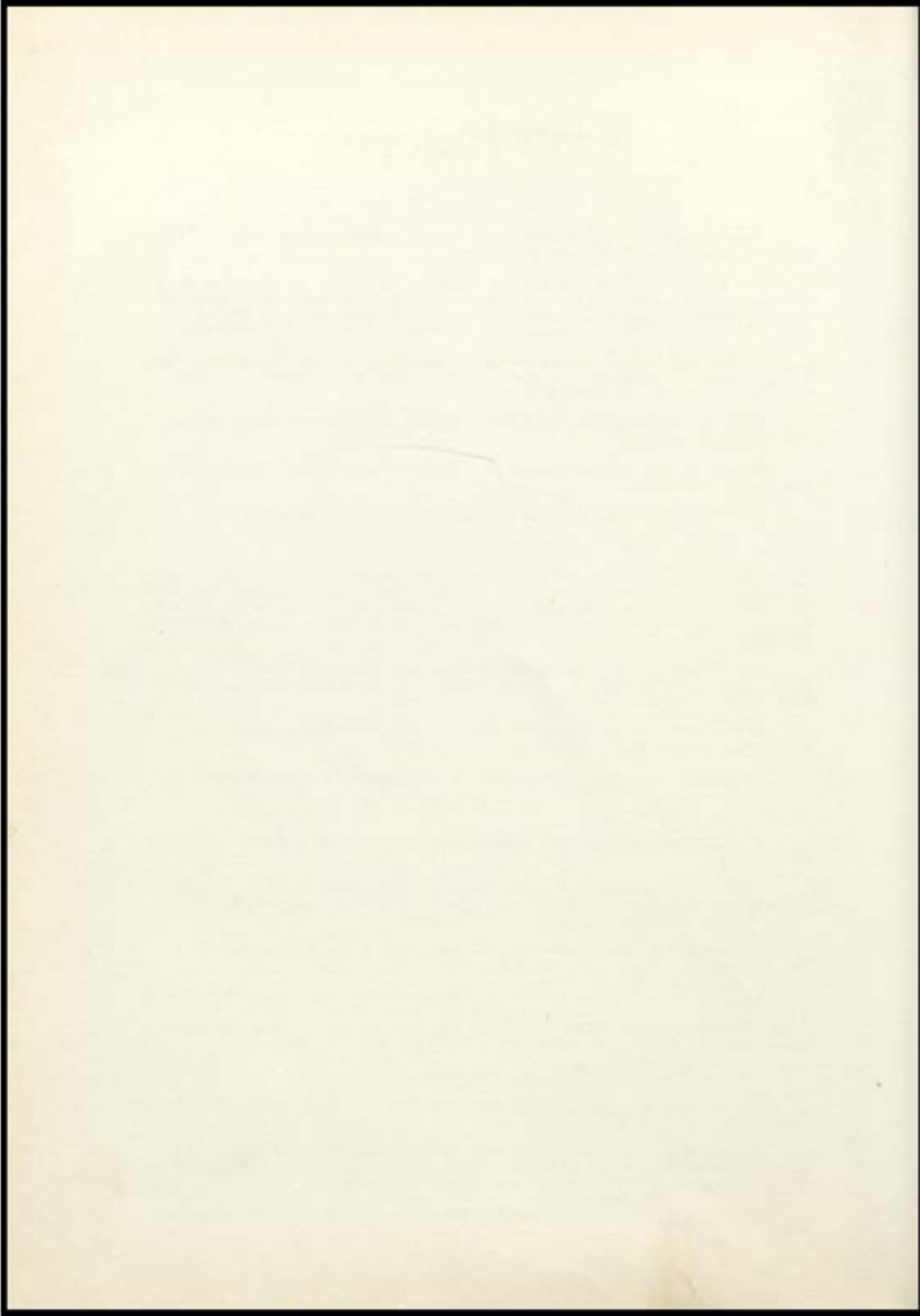

To the coming Seniors, we leave our dignity, pride, and the hope that they will make use of the opportunities coming before them.

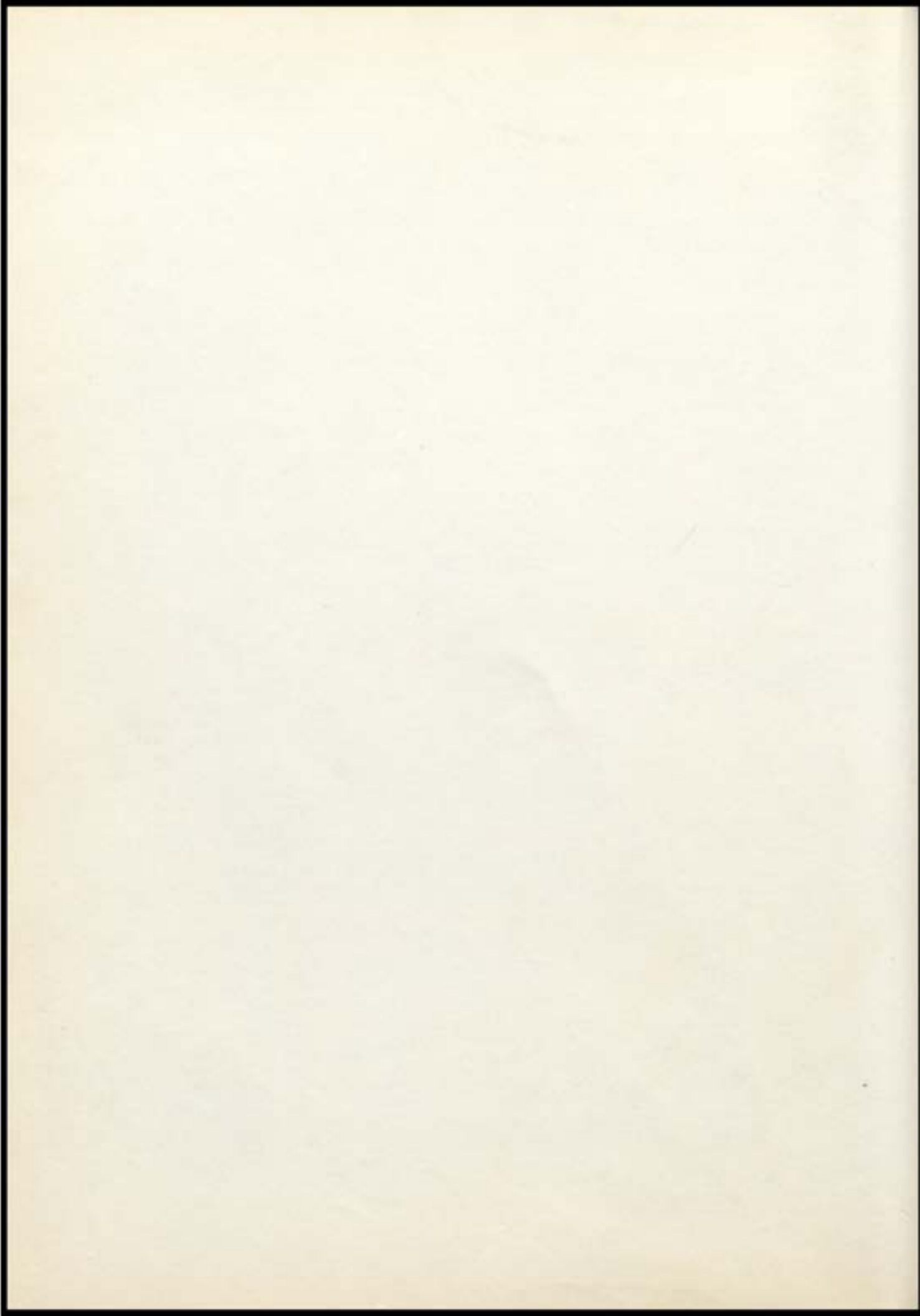

In the gossip column I read that another old friend, Dorothy Fleishman, was announcing her engagement to a famous pilot and they were going to fly to Paris and be married.

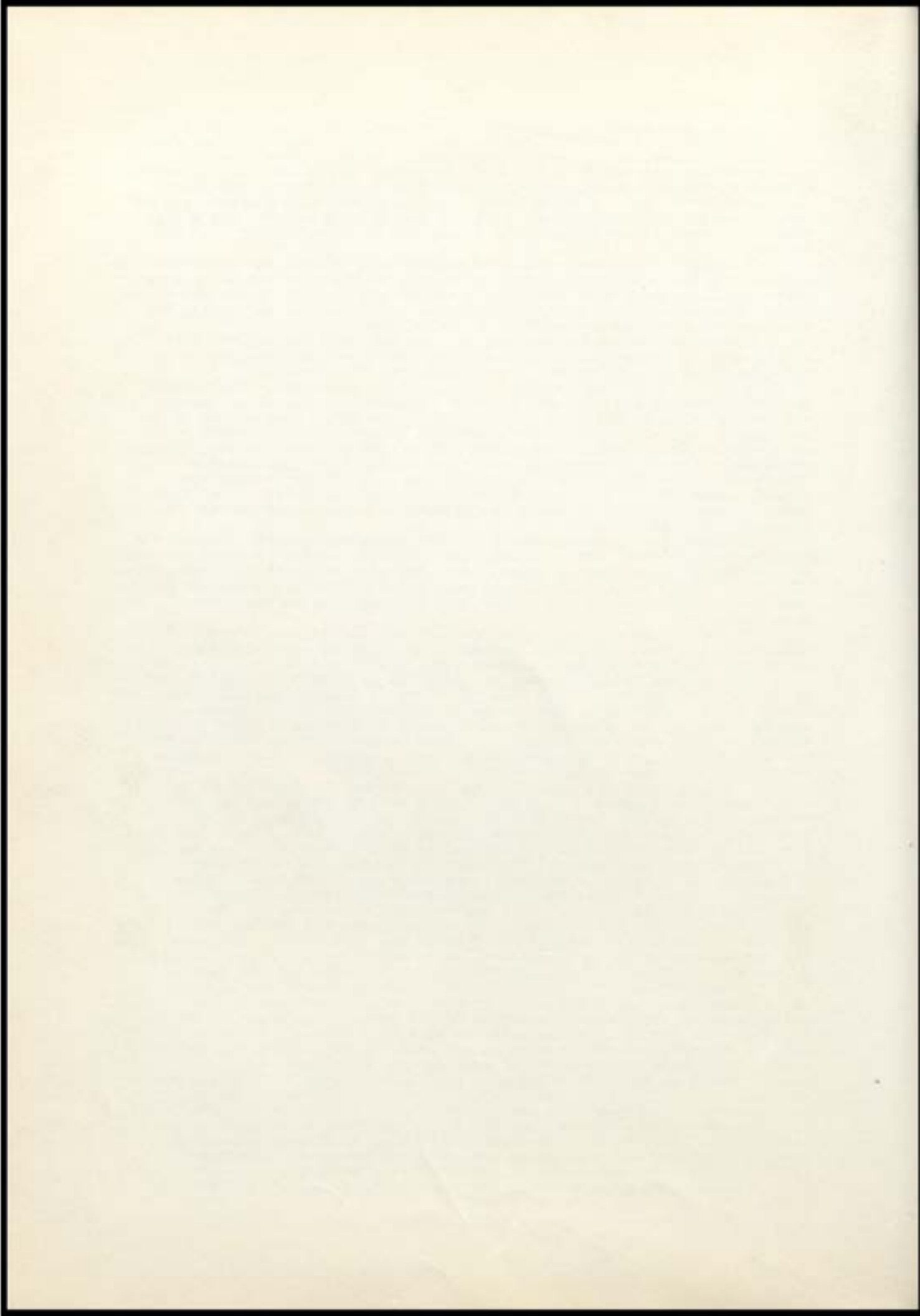

I decided my trip had been very, very beneficial and I just wonder, "could it all ready be true?"

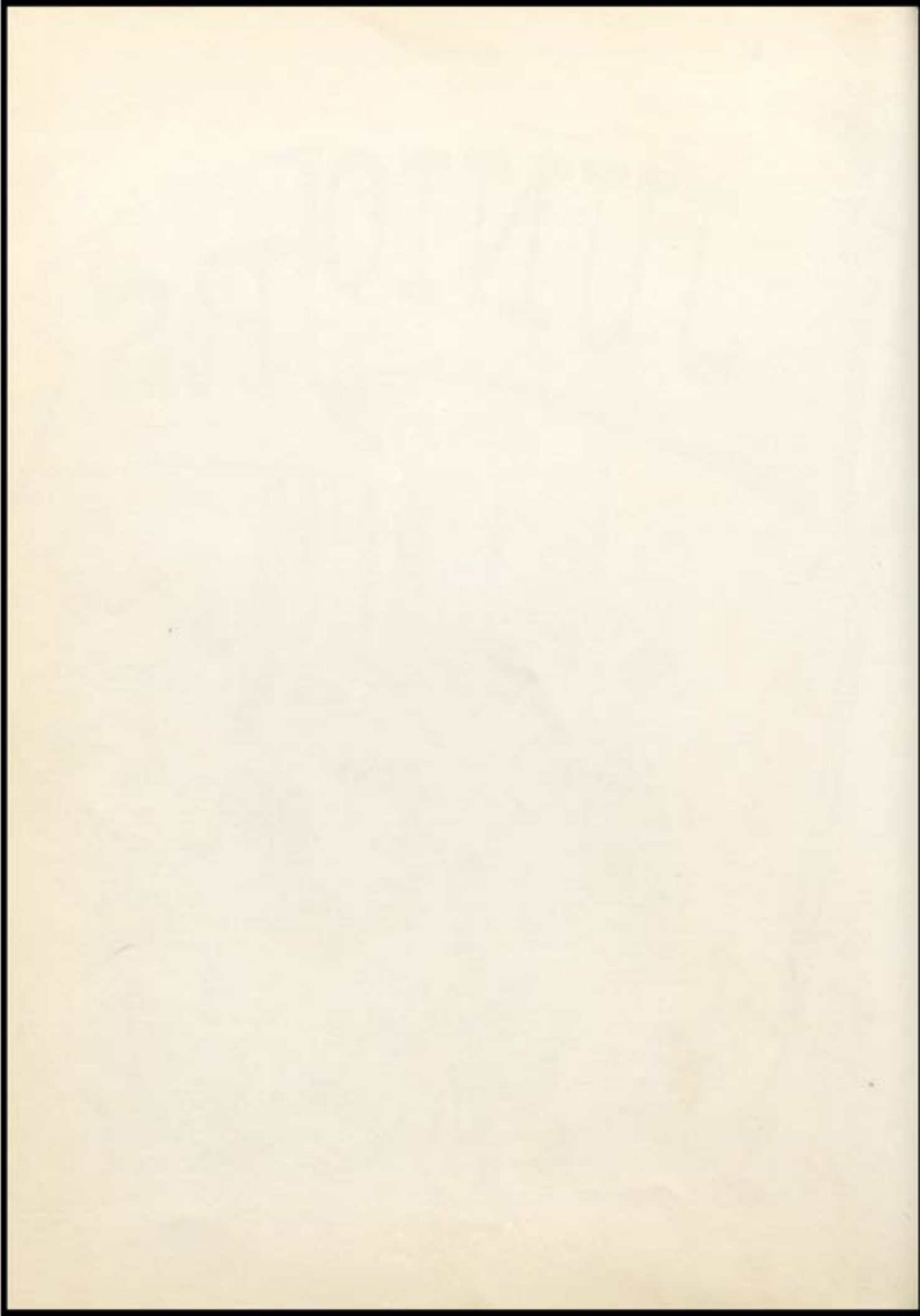

Leon, a senior at Chrisney High School, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Leo Weber.



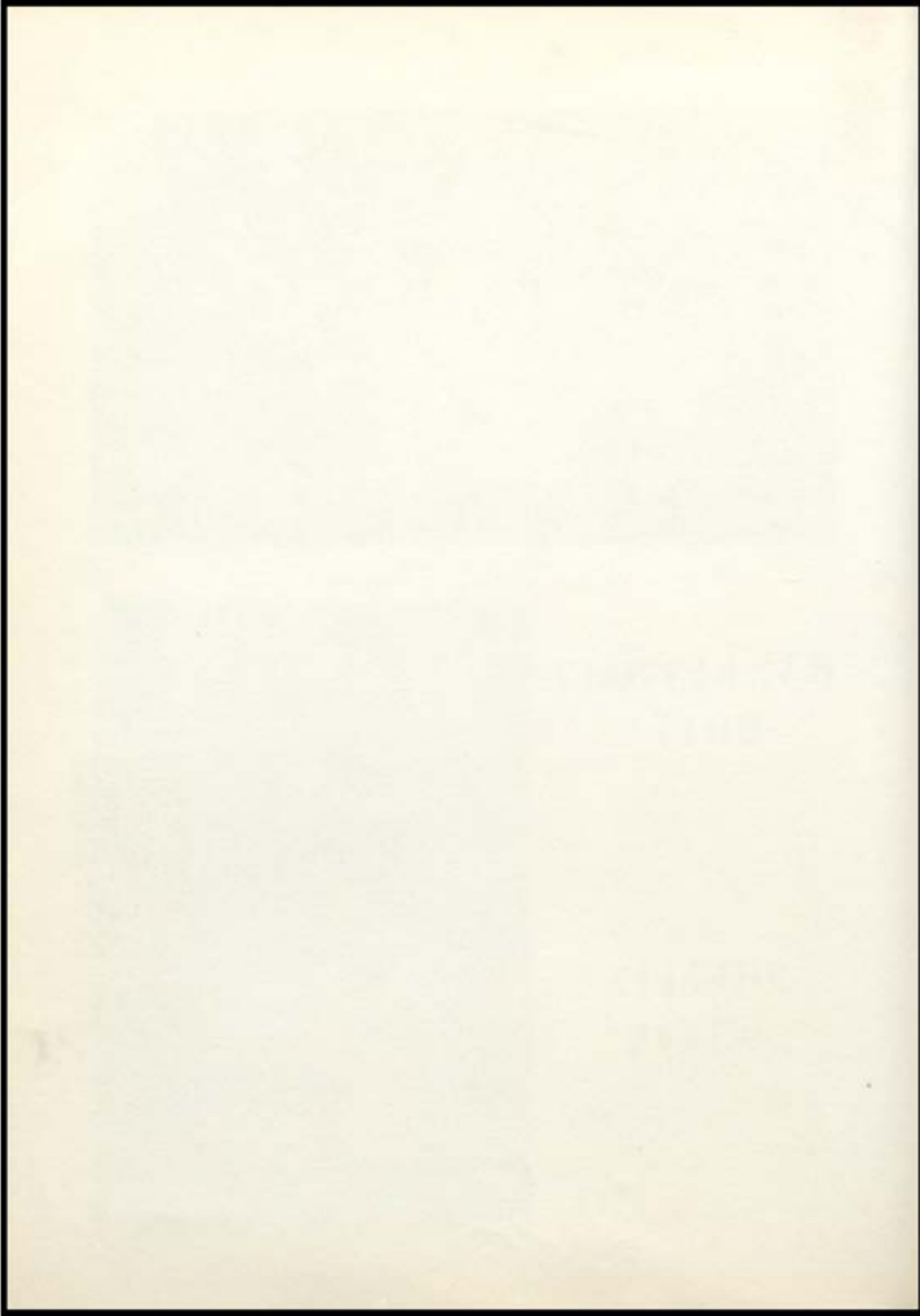
